The vigil is held on the memorial walk where four of our fellow brethren have been remembered. The plaques are located near the Borneo Memorial. Turn into the Tennis Club driveway located on Kings Park Rd where Outram St intersects. Follow the road around and park in the Car Park next to the tennis club, form up is at 1830 hours.

The Vigil will be preceded by a Sunset Service being conducted around the Flame Of Remembrance Kings Park, commencing at 1700 hours.

All members are invited and encouraged to attend as this is a very somber and moving ceremony dedicated to members of the <u>RAEME Family</u>.

WX9135 Craftsman Leslie Prior, 2/10th Ordnance Workshop, Australian Corps of Electrical & Mechanical Engineers. He was one of over 2000 Allied prisoners of war (POW) held in the Sandakan POW camp in north Borneo, having been transferred there from Singapore as a part of B Force. The 1494 POW's that made up B Force, were transported from Changi on 7 July 1942 on board the tramp ship Ubi Maru, arriving in Sandakan Harbour on 18 July 1942. Craftsman Prior, aged 40, died as a prisoner of the Japanese on 18 April 1945. He was the son of Henry and Charlotte Prior, and the husband of Hetty Prior, of Mount Hawthorn







GOVERNMENT LAUNCHES MENTAL HEALTH APP FOR PAST AND PRESENT MILITARY PERSONNEL

A new mobile phone app to help serving and ex-serving ADF personnel manage stress and build their psychological resilience is available to download for free from the iOS app store and Android Google Play.

Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Senator the Hon Michael Ronaldson and Assistant Minister for Defence, the Hon Stuart Robert MP, officially launched the *High Res* app today saying it was part of the Australian Government's innovative approach to improving mental health outcomes for defence personnel and younger veterans.

"We recognise the unique nature of military service, which is why we are developing these specifically designed resources for the Defence and veteran community," Senator Ronaldson said.

"We also recognise the current generation of Defence personnel and younger veterans generally engage with support services differently to older veterans. That is why we are actively developing new products such as *High Res*."

The *High Res* app features two major functions:

- "'Stress Management' helps users manage their immediate reactions to a stressful situation. The app prompts users to test their physical, cognitive, emotional and behavioural reactions and helps them adjust their response with the use of tools on the app.
- "'Performance Training' helps to optimise mental performance with regular resilience training and will assist users to better respond to future challenges at work and in life.

The *High Res* app has been developed in collaboration with the Department of Defence and is based on Defence's BattleSMART self-management and resilience training program.

Minister Robert said the app used Cognitive Behavioural Therapy tools and applied them to daily stress management and resilience training.

"We know we need to exercise our bodies to get fit, but how often do we exercise our minds? Being resilient means having the ability to deal with difficult situations and knowing the right response to use at the right time," Minister Robert said.

"The *High Res* app is like having a resilience toolbox in your back pocket to use whenever you feel the need to. Ultimately, it will help manage stress and over time build mental strength."

High Res is the latest example of DVA and Defence using emerging technology to help the defence community, including families, to raise awareness of mental health issues and improve access to professional support.

Other samples include the At Ease website, the PTSD Coach Australia and ON TRACK with the Right Mix mobile apps.

A Little bit of History

RAEME type units have existed in armies ever since a soldier first needed his armour repaired or a sword sharpened. Sun Tzu in his book on the Art of War even talks about the costs of repairing broken chariots, armour and weapons - and he was writing in the 5th Century BC!

In the Australian context, the Royal Corps of Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers was initially formed as AEME on December 1, 1942 having arisen from the Mechanical Engineering Branch of the AAOC and prior to that the Ordnance Department of the Army. We had already seen action in the first AIF as Ordnance Medium Workshops, Ordnance Mobile Workshops and Salvage Workshops, and had a lineage that dated back to the very first days of the country.

Captain Arthur Phillip himself in fact, when putting together the First Fleet, stipulated that some of the marines who were to accompany it were to be Artificers, and in 1800 Governor King appointed Captain Edward Abbot to the position of Engineer and Artillery Officer Superintending the Defences. We've certainly been around a long time but it is interesting to note just how long.

The earliest specific mention of a RAEME type organisation in antiquity comes from Vegetius, the bloke who wrote the first set of Pams for the Roman Army in the 4th century. He mentions that in the Praefecture of the Workmen (read CSSB), the Legion had a train of "workmen of every kind... for making and repairing the wooden siege towers, arms carriages and the various sorts of machines and engines for the attack or defence of places". He goes on to talk about "travelling workshops in which shields, cuirasses, helmets, bows, arrows, javelins and offensive and defensive arms of all kinds were made and repaired".

This sounds remarkably like a description of base workshop and a field workshop doesn't it?

You can almost imagine the AC (Artificer Centurion) having the following argument. "Listen Squeezius Maximus I don't give a two denarii about what that bloody Numidian barbarian in the store says but if I don't get some new road wheels for the ballistae soon those Thracian dropshorts won't even be going out the front gate. Tell him to remove his digitanus from his rotunda and bring some up from the other cohort, or by Jupiter, I'll be having words with the Camp Praefect!"

In fact the Legion had over one hundred and fifty specialist ECN's on its orbat. Each century also had its own tech support team consisting of an armourer and a cartwright. They were termed immunes and were paid at a higher rate than the rest of the legionaries and were immune from being called up for combat duties unless as part of an operation involving the full Legion.

Regarding our own origins, in the first AIF tradesmen on the Western front were initially seconded to British workshop companies under the control of Royal Ordinance. These were subsequently reabsorbed back into the AIF as purely Australian units. In our particular case 17 British Mobile Workshop became the AIF's 2 Mobile Ordnance Workshop (Medium) in Nov 1918. In World War Two, 113 Independent Brigade Workshop was formed in Port Moresby and later moved to Bougainville.

These two are the parent units of 113. With the disestablishment of the 2nd AIF in 1948, the "interim army" formed an AEME pool at Karrakatta on 1 Jul 1948. On establishment of the Australian Regular Army and the CMF, 2 Medium Workshop was formed from this pool on 1 October 1949, based where 16Bn Tech Spt is currently located. Unfortunately our new build workshops were taken over by XLH as their EsSalt lines and we were moved Artillery Barracks in 1956, being renamed as 113 Independent Brigade Workshop in 1957.

The Wearing Of The Returned From Active Service Badge (RASB)

It has been noted that a number of members incorrectly wear the **Returned from Active Service Badge** (RASB). Here, advice is provided on the wearing of this badge, through an excerpt from RSL State By-Law 14.6 and

14.7, which decrees:

"The Returned from Active Service Badge (RASB) is issued to Australian Defence Force personnel who have rendered warlike service. The badge enables individuals to display their involvement in warlike service when wearing civilian attire. It is worn when the wearing of service awards is not appropriate or possible. Conversely, it should not be worn when wearing service awards".

The RASB is only worn by the person to whom it has been issued.

Rules also apply to Family members and others, who wear a deceased person's awards on appropriate occasions, they <u>do</u> <u>not</u> wear the RASB."

So ...simply.... the RAS Badge is NOT worn when wearing medals.



Notice of Lapsed Membership

EME Association History

While sorting files ready for digitisation a folder containing the inaugural minutes WA Division of the Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (AEME) Association dating from 12 March 1946 were rediscovered.

A search of the RAEME websites reveals that the AEME Association as it was originally called was established from the top down. It began in Melbourne on November the 2nd 1944, with a well attended meeting. The meeting formed the Melbourne Division, an action that some thought was putting the cart before the horse as there was no federal body in existence at that time. This was rectified in Sydney in January the 3rd 1945, when Provisional Federal Council of AEME was founded.

The inaugural meeting of the WA Division was held at the 16 Battalion Drill Hall, Bazaar Terrace (now Mounts Bay road), Perth. The meeting was chaired by Mr (MAJ) Hudson and with Mr Few taking notes. The meeting elected Mr J. Davenport as President, Mr Moran as Secretary and Mr Few as the Treasurer. Committee members elected were: Miss Platt, Mr Frazer, Miss Bride and Mr Anderson. There were 61 financial members by the end of the meeting.

The main issues discussed were whether to approach other associations in order to approach the Government on post-war reconstruction and rehabilitation and where "Smoke social"

events could be held.

To complete the history the association requests that members search their archives and see if they have copies of any minutes. The search is for any of the RAEME Associations. The RAEME Association WA has located copies of AGM and Committee meetings from the following periods:
